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The particulars of a terrible case of child poisoning at San Rafael, Marin county, have just been made public. A man named Walter Skidmore and his wife, a Spanish woman, had a child some three weeks ago. On Sunday she laid the child down in a room and went into the adjoining apartment to dress herself. While thus occupied, Skidmore entered the apartment with the child. The woman hearing the latter cry out, rushed in, exclaiming, "Skidmore you have poisoned my child." She took the child in her arms and attempted to go for a doctor, but was prevented by her husband, who held her back. Finally, he consented to go for the physician. The latter came and found strychnine in the child's mouth and upon its lips, and so far gone that it could not possibly live. He immediately went for the Coroner; subsequent to the arrival of the latter the child died. Yesterday morning an inquest was held and the jury returned a verdict to the effect that the child died from the effects of strychnine administered by Walter Skidmore. The latter meanwhile had made his escape, but a warrant was immediately issued for his arrest. Harris, of San Rafael, arrived in town to-day with the warrant in search of Skidmore, it being the general impression that he had fled to this city.
